REFLECTION:

Visit a cemetery and you will see crosses on headstones. Along roads where fatal accidents have occurred, there are often crosses in ditches. Christian churches and hospital chapels are adorned with crosses, as are many Christians, themselves. Catholic churches go one step further and display crucifixes depicting the figure of the suffering or dead Christ on the cross. We Catholics bless ourselves, begin and end our prayers by signing ourselves with the cross.

Is it odd to have the cross, an instrument of cruel torture and death, be so prominent in our lives? Those who don't believe that Jesus Christ suffered and died on the cross for our benefit may think so. As Christians though, we believe that Jesus, whose very name means "God saves," took what is one of the worst inventions of man and turned it into a vehicle of salvation. On his cross, Jesus mercifully loved us by taking on the consequences of our sins so that we could be reunited with God in love.

As a result, the crosses we see in ditches and cemeteries represent the hope of the bereaved that their loved ones are with God. The crosses and crucifixes in churches and hospitals represent the hope that all will be spiritually well, even if physical death should occur. When we venerate the cross, we are worshipping God for the most merciful gift that we will ever receive.

How can we thank Jesus Christ for such a gift? He said, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 16:24–25). Let us give thanks to the Lord by picking up the crosses in our lives and offering our sufferings to him.

Catholic Catechesis: September 14 marks The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross, which had fallen into the hands of the Persians. This precious relic was recovered and returned to Jerusalem by Emperor Heralius in 629. This day is also called the Triumph of the Cross, Elevation of the Cross, and Holy Cross Day. Our Mother Church sings of the triumph of the Cross, the instrument of redemption.

Now That You Know, Here's What To Do: Consider making the Stations of the Cross; pay particular attention to each time you hear this prayer.

We adore you, O Christ, and praise You, Because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world.
